


So I'll end for now by reiterating how excited Darlene, I and our collie Bradley, are to be here. I look forward to getting to know and serve you. Blessings!

Please place all yard waste (including grass clippings) in a privately owned 35-gallon or less trash receptacle It is against City of Dover Code (Sec. 98-5c) "to sweep, blow, or otherwise discharge grass clippings into any street, sidewalk, storm drain, or water course more than incidental amounts of grass."



Do not discharge or pile your clippings in the street

Help the City of Dover improve water quality in our streams and rivers by keeping your grass clippings on your lawn!
Did you know, it is against City of Dover Code (Sec. 98-5c) "to sweep, blow, or otherwise discharge grass clippings into any street, sidewalk, storm drain, or water course more than incidental amounts of grass". All yard waste (including grass clippings) should be placed in a privately owned 35-gallon or less trash receptacle.




